Answer Explanation: Remember that;

$>$ is a symbol used to show numbers greater than the other.

$<$ is a symbol used to show numbers less than the other.

$=$ is a symbol used to show numbers having the same value.

For example: Compare 64 831 $\square$ 65 578

Line up the numbers according to their place values	Compare at the highest value	If numbers at the highest place value are the same, go to the next digit to the right
6 4 8 3 1 6 5 5 7 8	6 4831 6 5578	6 4831 6 5578

Now, compare 4 and 5, which one is greater or lesser.

4 is less than 5. So, the answer is $<$.

Therefore, 64 831 $<$ 65 578
